When one is talking about sports, it is not uncommon to leave chess out of the topic. Although being recognized as a sport by International Olympic Committee, chess has never been included in the Olympic Games. Thus, this picture expresses the wish for that status to be changed. The three pieces covering the large part of the screen are the Bishop, the King and the Queen. In chess, the Bishop moves diagonally, which represents the idea of swiftness. The King, on the other hand, is the symbol of highness and the Queen, the most powerful piece, is the symbol of strength. Together, they make up the Olympic motto, “Swifter-Higher-Stronger” (Citius-Altius-Fortius). The infinity sign on the upper left represents the limitless number of chess games, that each game is unique with numerous moves. On the right hand sign, the Olympic symbol joining with the Queen to form a heart shape, expressing the desire of chess-lovers for chess to be part of the Olympic Games.
